Lay Leader Training

Today we commission the lay leadership training participants. This two-year program includes a study of leadership examples in the Bible and instruction on best practices in leadership. Following instruction, each selected a project to exercise these leadership skills while under the direction and coaching of the trainers. They will be in the Ministry Center after worship and would love to share more information with you about the projects described below.

Tony Acosta - St. Peter's Garden Project: This project will engage members and families in the healthy hobby of gardening while connecting the generations and encouraging fellowship. The team will begin by creating a small raised garden that will be tended by members of the congregation and students.

Bill Habegger - Man Up: A men's ministry program designed to involve men of St. Peter's in activities that provide opportunities to understand manhood *not* as the world defines it, but instead how God intended it. Bill will lead a small leadership group that will encourage, equip, and enable a larger group of men to organize and lead Man Up events for participation by an even larger group of men.

Sarah Horacek - Game Night: Sarah will develop and lead a team to help plan St Peter's Game Nights. The intention is for this to be an ongoing quarterly event in which all are invited for fun, fellowship, and a little friendly competition. These special events will bring the St Peter's church family closer together and will create family connections between the preschool and day school families.

Alicia Rodenbeck - Whose Bible is it Anyway? – Alicia will lead a new type of study group designed for ages 10 to adult to explore and share God's word together through theatre games, improvisation, and performances for the congregation.

Joy Weller - Joy will lead a team focused on building a "bridge" to connect church and preschool families for life-long connections. They will offer positive caring support and encouragement to children and their families entering or transitioning into preschool or day school. They will also answer questions, find resources, and begin building friendships. It's a family of faith with an open hand.

Sarah Wenzel - Sarah will use her skills to direct volunteers for this year's Vacation Bible School program.

Brian West - His background and passion in Wellness led to the creation of a Wellness Team. The team, including Jill Rodenbeck, Kara West, and Troy Buuck (along with Pastor Koehneke as consultant), is planning a ½ day *Run Hard, Rest Well* retreat at Camp Lutherhaven in April for the staff of our church, day school, and preschool along with their spouses. The retreat, facilitated by Brenda Jank, will focus on the importance of balancing work and rest.
