St. Peter's Own Hayley Grisez Wins Grant

Concordia Lutheran High School Junior Hayley Grisez was awarded a \$3,000 grant to encourage more girls to consider the computer science field. This grant was awarded through the National Center for Women in Technology (NCWIT). She is using the funds to create a computer programming summer camp this summer for girls in 7th and 8th grades (2018-19 school year).

"I had a small idea, and it just grew so fast," said Grisez, who credits her teacher, Scott Storm, for giving her this opportunity.

The camp will run 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. July 30 through August 2 at Concordia. It's \$100 per student, and campers will receive a Raspberry Pi programming kit, a T-shirt and a bag of goodies from NCWIT. Through the camp, girls will learn basic Java coding, complete challenges with robots, and work in teams to create a Raspberry Pi program.

"There's a smaller amount of girls in technology," Grisez said. "We want them to be equally represented and seen as able to do it and know that they can do it."

Grisez, an Honors Academy student who is putting the camp together for her senior project, hopes to continue the camp year after year. "It's important for all people to be better at technology," she said.
