From Your Pastors on Holy Communion

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Since we have not been able to join together for in-person worship at St. Peter's due to the pandemic, obviously that means we have not been able to celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Communion together either. We, as your pastors, recognize that the inability to commune together is no small matter. We have explored various options of how we might distribute the Sacrament to our members but continue to run into obstacles.

Turning to our synod's leadership for direction, we have been guided to suspend the corporate celebration of the Sacrament until such time when we can resume in-person worship. Even though it would be our desire to find some way to distribute the Sacrament to all our communicants, nevertheless, we have chosen to heed the wise counsel of our denominational leadership. In their correspondence with us, they pointed out some interesting points to consider:

We are not in uncharted territory on this matter.

Over the course of history, there have been times when the church has had to suspend, for a period of time, the corporate celebration of Holy Communion (including during the great influenza epidemic of 1918-1919).

Even though the Sacrament of Holy Communion is a unique way in which God delivers to repentant sinners the forgiveness of sins, it is not the only means by which He does so.

Forgiveness of sins is still offered and given through the proclamation of the gospel as it is read and proclaimed to you. (By the way, this is why we have been going to all the trouble of live-steaming and recording our worship services for you, as well as seeking ways to provide you with other resources, in order that you might continue to hear the good news of forgiveness and salvation in Christ. So please continue to utilize these various resources.)

Finally, from a biblical and theological standpoint,

the well-meaning efforts of trying to consecrate and distribute the Sacrament through livestreaming or a "drive-thru" in the church parking lot creates doubts and uncertainty about the legitimacy of the Sacrament and, therefore, negates its purpose.

Again, we cannot express enough how we long for that time when we will be able to come back together for in-person worship and to celebrate the Lord's Supper. In the meantime, please continue to join us in fervent prayer, asking the Lord to put an end to this deadly pandemic that is killing thousands and to restore to us the regular administration of the blessed Sacrament of Holy Communion. As always, please feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns you may have. We are here to serve you.
