Letter from the Pastors

Dear Friends in Christ,

We pastors (and Vicar) like questions. In fact, asking questions is a good way to grow in your faith. One question that was recently put to us was regarding the large cross above the altar in the sanctuary that displays the a wood carving of the crucified Christ on it (commonly referred to as a crucifix). The question was whether or not it was appropriate to display a crucifix since Jesus no longer is on the cross, but has risen from the dead?

First of all, that's a good question and thanks for asking it. Secondly, let us affirm very clearly, as Scripture proclaims, that Christ is risen from the dead! As God's people, no one denies that glorious, life-saving fact. Thirdly, keep in mind that crosses, whether they are empty or have the figure of Jesus on them, are simply a symbol of His suffering and death on our behalf to save us from sin, death, and the power of the devil. Therefore, whereas a crucifix more graphically symbolizes Jesus' suffering and death, the empty cross does that as well. In other words, they both convey the same reminder to us. That being said, claiming the freedom which God's Word gives us on these kinds of matters, Lutherans are neither commanded nor forbidden to use one over the other.

Finally, during the time of the Reformation, there were some who wanted to remove all images, including the crucifix, from their churches. They believed such images constituted idolatry. Consequently, the empty cross was preferred and some even suggested that the empty cross symbolizes Jesus' resurrection. That, of course, is not correct as it is the empty tomb that proves Jesus' resurrection. The cross, as stated above, is a symbol of suffering and death on our behalf. So, until Jesus returns, we all live under the cross in this life. We will encounter various kinds of difficulty and suffering in this world and, yes, we will eventually die in the sure and certain hope of life forever with our risen Lord. But until then, the crucifix (or empty cross) remind us that Jesus loved us to death and that, even in our own suffering in this world, we belong to Him both now and forever.

"Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God." (Hebrews 12:2)

Mission News

Life in Uruguay

As we look forward to celebrating the one-year anniversary of St. Peter's connection with Missionary James Sharp on January 30-31, let's refresh what we know about the mission in Uruguay. Pastor Sharp serves three Lutheran congregations, two in Montevideo where he lives (approximately 150 members and 30 members) and one church about two hours to the north (30 members).

Pastor Sharp's four children attend Lutheran schools: Elias, a freshman at St. Paul High School in Concordia, MO; and the three younger children at Colegio San Pablo (St. Paul's Lutheran School, Montevideo, a school of 1400) where Mrs. Sharp is a teacher. The school year in Uruguay runs from March to Dec. 1, so it is now summer break. Christmas (known as "Family Day") is often celebrated on the beaches.

Covid-19 has had an impact on Uruguay with a shut-down which runs until the end of January. Live-stream worship services are being used. The country has a population half the size of Indiana, but where we have had over 9,000 Covid-related deaths, Uruguay has had around 250. The borders are closed, and no one can leave without a special passport showing proof of vaccination. Vaccinations are hard to procure since the small market of Uruguay is not attractive to the labs which produce the vaccine.

Knowing that travel has been limited is difficult for our mission family, especially since Pastor Sharp's father passed away last spring leaving his mother a widow. (He was not able to attend the funeral because of lack of flights.) It also must be challenging for Elias being so far away and travel restricted.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) – If you are over 70½ and have an IRA, you can take advantage of the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. This distribution must be a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity such as St. Peter's Lutheran Church and School. The power of this direct transfer is that you avoid having to pay federal tax on this distribution. In addition, if you are age 72 or older, this should qualify to eliminate or reduce your required minimum distributions. Several of your fellow members are currently take advantage of this tax provision with direct distributions to the church.
