# **Easter Worship**

Jesus is alive, and His church is too, and I can hardly wait until our building comes alive on Easter morning with all of you. Perhaps one of the greatest challenges this past year has been the restrictions that have prevented us from spending time in fellowship with one another. I dream of the day when we can resume our lively congregational activities, full of smiles, handshakes, and hugs.

I am eagerly anticipating this Easter celebration, especially since we were unable to be together last year. I would like to personally invite each and every one of you to join us for Easter worship. This year we will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior in a socially distant way. Due to state mandated guidelines, our Sanctuary only holds approximately 25% of its previous pre-pandemic capacity and since Easter is typically a time when we are near capacity for worship, we will have to be a little creative and flexible this year.

In order to assure that all are able to worship, we need your help. Just as we did on Christmas Eve, we will take reservations for reserved seating for each of the four worship services offered. As of this weekend, you can begin requesting seating immediately. After March 17, we will assign seats for all the reservations we have received up to that point. Following this, seats will be assigned on a first come first served basis. Requesting your reservation is as simple as following these steps:

#### Select your worship service.

There will be four worship services this Easter.

- 1. 6:30 am Traditional worship in the Sanctuary with communion. This is traditionally a quieter service. So, if you would prefer to avoid a large crowd, we encourage you to consider this service time.
- 2. 8:00 am Traditional worship in the Sanctuary with communion.
- 3. 10:30 am Traditional worship in the Sanctuary with communion.
- 4. Stepping Stones style worship in the Church Gym with breakfast and communion. This worship service will contain the familiar liturgy and hymns but will be presented in the same style as our Monday evening Stepping Stones service. A free breakfast will be served from 8:45-9:10 for all those who will attend this service. Worship will

begin shortly thereafter. You will worship at a table with your family/group. This is sure to be a meaningful, uplifting time of worship and fellowship.

#### Request your seating assignment.

You can do this in 3 ways:

- 1. Complete the Google Request form. <u>Click here to complete the form.</u> Once complete, you will receive a confirmation email. You will receive a second email from the church office once your seats have been assigned.
- 2. Complete the paper Request form. Those are found in the Ministry Center. You can drop your completed form in the Ministry Center or mail it to the church office.
- 3. Call the church office. Amy and Clarissa will be happy to hear from you and can help you complete your request Monday-Friday from 8-4.

Once your seats have been assigned you will receive an email (or a letter in the mail if you do not have email) with the seating assignment, a seating chart, and an FAQ page with answers to questions such as what to do if you need to change your mind about something.

#### Attend worship.

Elders and ushers will be on hand Easter morning to help you find your assigned seat. Even if you forget where you are supposed to sit, we will have charts out to help everyone find a seat.

My prayer is that before too long, all these challenges of the pandemic will be just a memory. In the meantime, I thank you wholeheartedly for your help and support.

# **Stay Informed!**

As individual Christian citizens, we have the privilege of holding and expressing opinions on the full spectrum of public policy issues. As your pastors, we proclaim to you both the law and gospel of God's Word. We trust that the Spirit will guide you as you live out the various vocations in which God has placed you – including your vocation as a citizen of this country.

Our church body (The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod) has limited out its corporate speech to four specific areas of public life. Those would be: life issues, family and sexuality, religious freedom, and parental choice in education. Recently, our Indiana District President, Rev. Daniel Brege, alerted us to "The Equality Act" which was passed by the U.S. House of Representatives and has now moved to the U.S. Senate. If passed by the Senate and made law, The Equality Act would, "cost our country countless charitable organizations, which means fewer institutions would be available to serve populations in need," according to the LC-MS.

Our church body also states, "The Equality Act actually furthers inequality, especially for women and girls, by punishing anyone who does not affirm a single viewpoint of marriage and biological sex. A federal sexual orientation and gender identity law would empower the government to interfere in how regular Americans think, speak, and act at home, at school, at work and at play. Any bill promoting such authoritarianism is a danger to our freedoms."

In case you are not aware of this controversial piece of legislation, we wanted to draw your attention to it, both so that you could be aware of the situation and respond with prayer or, if you feel moved to do so, by contacting your Indiana representatives.
