This past Tuesday, Allen County's advisory level elevated to orange requiring this group to reconvene and evaluate our current circumstance. The task force reviewed Dr. Sutter's recommendations and have made the following adjustments in order to care for the welfare of our members and visitors, especially as it relates to worship. The following modifications are in place and **will be effective Saturday, August 21, 2021.**

While there are many different factors a year and a half into the pandemic, the COVID-19 task force wants to encourage our members to do what they are comfortable with as it relates to attending worship.

Precautions that remain in place:

- Hand sanitizer is available throughout our facility (entrances and inside sanctuary)
- Masks are available through our facility (located at all entrances)
- High touch areas are routinely cleaned and sanitized

Regarding Saturday & Sunday Worship Services

- Worship will continue as is & members are encouraged to do what they are comfortable with as it relates to wearing or not wearing a mask.
- Members are asked to be observant of social distancing and others around them

Regarding Monday Worship:

To better serve those members requesting a safer environment to worship in, we are dedicating Monday service to being a <u>mask required service with social distancing</u>. Additionally, to better serve our families with children we have moved the <u>start time of this service to 6PM</u>. These changes will begin on <u>Monday</u>, <u>August 23</u>.

In closing, as we continue to battle COVID-19 and its ever changing effects, we ask you to keep in your prayers that God would bring an end to this pandemic, that we could all have patient hearts, and keep those who are sick with it, are first responders to it, caring for those with it, or those who are in any other way affected by it, steadfast in their faith.

Our guest speaker will be Missionary Joe Boway from Liberian Children's Mission. Joe Boway was commissioned in 2004 as a missionary to the people of Liberia by New Life Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne. Joe was born in Liberia, West Africa and came to the US in 1990 due to the civil war in Liberia. While Joe was a student at Taylor University, he did student teaching at Bethlehem. He and Glendora were married in 2004, and were blessed with two sons, Joe Weatu and Joshua Glenn Gbaweah. Joe's focus has been in opening schools and providing education for the children of Liberia. Because of the civil war, a whole generation of Liberian children were without any education. There are now over 5,000 students in 14 schools, at latest count. Over 75% of the new students are from a non-church background.
