Do you know what the state of mental health is in Indiana or in the nation?

Are you aware of how many of your neighbors are hurting?

Do you know that as many as 1 in 4 of our fellow Hoosiers is suffering from a range of mental health concerns such as anxiety, depression, or grief?

Our guest speaker, Professor Jordan-Miles, is the director of the Behavioral Health and Family Studies Institute at Purdue University Fort Wayne and is also the project director of the Indiana Suicide Prevention Coalition.

Our role as a community of believers has always been to help one another, rely on one another, and lift each other up. Discover what we can do to help ourselves and others who are suffering from these crushing and pervasive issues. St. Peter's is committed to sharing these realities with our members and to walking together in our Community of Care through love of Jesus Christ. Join us so that we can better understand how our church can respond to these questions in a meaningful way.

After our presentation, stay with us for a special fundraising dinner hosted by St. Peter's High School Youth Group where they will share what they did on the last mission trip and what they are looking forward to experiencing this year. They will offer a traditional Oktoberfest menu. Seating for dinner is limited to 150 individuals, so please sign up today by signing up in the Ministry Center. Prof. Jordan-Miles provides leadership statewide and beyond state lines on concerns related to mental and behavioral health. Her responsibilities include professional trainings to public and private school districts, colleges/universities, faith communities, and the criminal justice system. She provides presentations, resources and trainings in suicide intervention and prevention to organizations and communities to increase awareness of the importance of mental wellness and to eliminate the stigma towards help-seeking behaviors.


