# New national 988 phone number for mental health emergencies launched on July 16

The mental health version of 911 launched nationwide on July 16 with hopes it will be a game changer for suicide prevention and other mental health emergencies. The new

national three-digit number **988** will offer a direct connection to compassionate, accessible care and support for anyone experiencing mental health-related distress – whether that be thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crisis, or any other kind of emotional distress. People can also dial **988** if they are worried about a loved one who may need crisis support.

When people call, text, or chat **988**, they will be connected to trained counselors that are part of the existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline network. These trained counselors will listen, understand how people's problems are affecting them, provide support, and connect them to resources if necessary. Numerous studies have shown that callers feel less depressed, less overwhelmed, less suicidal, and more hopeful after speaking with a Lifeline counselor.

# The current Lifeline phone number (1-800-273-8255) will always remain available to people in emotional distress or suicidal crisis, even after 988 is launched nationally.

911 isn't going away, this is just another option specifically for anyone experiencing mental health related distress. Call 911 for police, fire and medical emergencies. Call **988** for thoughts of suicide, mental health or substance use crises, or any other kind of emotional distress. If you are not sure, call 911.
