Navigating Realm Together

We are definitely excited that so many of you have already set up your password for our new Realm ministry tool and Connect app. Keep an eye out for more troubleshooting tips like the one below.

Notifications Tip

- You can edit your settings for any notifications
 - \circ $\;$ To do this, log into the Realm Connect app.

- Click on the settings link. (For an Android phone, this will be on the left side menu.
 For an Apple phone, this will be a button on the bottom. You will likely need to click the "..." icon to reach more options.)
- From that setting section, you can edit your notifications for inbox messages and news feed messages.
- Please note, the news feed items will be posted within the "Members of St. Peter's" group. For questions, please contact the church office.

Did you know

- Realm is just the updated version of the database company we were previously using. It looks different, navigates different, and comes with the updated Connect app which replaces the old Church Life app.
- If you previously had a Church Life app, you already got the email to get the Realm Connect app. For security purposes, your password will need to be changed.


Bible Studies


