

adulthood. He attended Okmulgee public schools until graduation in 1990 and played football as an Okmulgee Bulldog during his high school years. Clayton started dating his wife during his sophomore year of high school and married her in 1994. Together they joined Trinity Lutheran Church, Okmulgee, OK shortly after they were married and have been members since that time. Clayton graduated Connors State College with an Associate in applied science of Criminal Justice. He started his 30-year law enforcement career as a dispatcher of Henryetta Police Department and shortly after marrying his high school sweetheart, became a police officer.



He worked at Henryetta police department as a street cop which furthered his career at Okmulgee police department as a street cop, lake patrol officer and detective which was his all-time favorite position on the police force. He was later hired on at Broken Arrow police department as a street cop and then applied to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol as a State Trooper and worked patrol for several years before becoming the State of Oklahoma's Governor's body guard for 16 years, which was his second favorite position he held during his law enforcement career. He traveled many places and saw many things as a Highway Patrol officer. He served on the Honor Guard for 19 of his 23 years in the Highway Patrol. He also had the opportunity to attend 3 years of Cadet Lawmen as a counselor during his career. He studied and obtained his Chaplain Certification during the last few years as a Trooper. He served on the Officer's Assistance program in the patrol to counsel fellow colleagues after traumatic events and was able to assist local police departments in the area during that time as well. He finished his career in law enforcement as a security guard of the state building in Tulsa, OK before retiring the Oklahoma Highway Patrol in 2022.

He and his wife have two beautiful daughters that are now 19 and 23 years old as well as a son-in-law. He says, "My calling to become a Lutheran Pastor was shortly after our oldest daughter had an experience that opened my family's eyes of God's works during a difficult time in our daughter's life. Our family has a testimony that most people never have the opportunity to experience." He has been preparing for Seminary since 2013 and worked toward his goals to be able to start seminary this past summer in June at the Concordia Theological Seminary. Before moving to Ft Wayne this year, he was able to serve as Properties Manager, Vice President, Elder and President of their home church, Trinity Lutheran in Okmulgee, OK. He participated in the Call process for their last two pastors during his time at Trinity Lutheran Church. He and his wife were both confirmed at their home church. He was also baptized at his home church along with both their girls.



Fall is officially here and it's that time of year for St. Peter's members to think about those needed and pesky repairs you've been putting off. According to the St. Peter's Bylaws, 3.12 Social Ministry Team, "The purpose of the Social Ministry Team is to discover the needs of individuals in the congregation, as well as in the community, of the aged, sick, distressed,

unemployed and poor, and seek ways and means of answering those needs." In past years we have met those needs in a varying number of ways.

We have helped members (both church & community) with drywall repairs, replacing faulty electrical outlets/switches, repairing or replacing broken light fixtures, fixing leaking faucets, unplugging drains, replacing broken storm windows, repairing rotted window sills, and replacing worn out water heaters. We have vacuumed inside, painted interior and exterior including trim, painted fences, washed siding, raked lawns, mowed yards, trimmed bushes, cleaned gutters, and handicapped accessible ramps have been built along with some concrete work. Rides have been provided to



and from church services, doctor's appointments, and members have been assisted in moving furniture. Meals have been supplied on many occasions as needed and some members have been supplied with groceries when the pantry was empty.


