

17

First Reading: Revelation 7:(2-8) 9-17 Epistle Reading: 1 John 3:1–3 Gospel Reading: *Matthew 5:1–12*

Greetings from your Pastoral Ministry Team,

Happy Thanksgiving everyone! Yes, this time of year has come around once again and we know it can be a busy one. In order to help with this, your Ministry Team would like to give you a head's up on all the special ministry related activities St. Peter's will offer this coming Advent Season. First, let's talk about this month's holiday.

Whenever we think about Thanksgiving we often picture our family seated around the table eating vast amounts of turkey and enjoying each other's company. While it is true we should be thankful for one another and the prosperity God has given us, there's even more to be thankful for.

Matthew 7:11 tells us, "So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him." Indeed, our Father is the giver of all good gifts and we're sure that on Thanksgiving you'll be thanking Him for hearth, home, food, company and fellowship. Don't forget that your Father has also given you His Son, and this is the gift that we are most grateful for because, truly, it is only His death on the Cross which rescues us from our own sinful selves. So, enjoy your Thanksgiving! Go out and play some football in the afternoon and rejoice as your grandchildren play in the leaves and make a mess of your house. But, be the most thankful that your Savior has died for you!

Celebrate with us at either our Thanksgiving Eve service at 7:00 pm or Thanksgiving Day service at 9:00 am.

On to our schedule. Advent is a wonderful time of year and God has richly blessed Saint Peter's with the opportunity to glorify Him with our praise and worship, and, we'd like to make you aware of some of the special worship opportunities we are offering this coming season.

- Firstly, the Ministry Team is proud to announce that we will be embarking on a new sermon series during Advent! "Let Me Tell You a Story," will include personal Christmas memories and stories from each of the Pastors that we hope will enrich and enliven your holiday spirit. Of course, each story will be tied to the readings of the day for that Sunday, but we hope to share a little bit of ourselves with you over the course of this part of the Church year.
- Secondly, our Midweek Advent services will continue as usual, but with a new worship opportunity we think will reach a segment of our Church that rarely receives acknowledgement. On December 21st St. Peter's will have its first Blue Christmas. This event will take place on the longest night of the year and is meant to honor those of us who have experienced a loss and may be grieving throughout the holidays. Of course, anyone can come, but this year's Blue Christmas is designed to provide a space and time for those who may not feel like Christmas is the happiest time of year. - Thirdly, our annual Hymn Sing is described under the Music Ministry section below. Be sure to take the survey for our Top 10 Christmas Hymn hits!

Fourthly, there will be a Christmas Carol Sing on the Twelfth Night of Christmas led by the Praise Team on Thursday, January 5th in celebration of the coming of our Lord Jesus! Twelfth Night is a longstanding Christian tradition that marks the end of Christmas and the beginning of Epiphany. Join us and the Praise Team as we sing the songs of Christmas and joyously praise the coming of our Savior.

Finally, may your Advent Season be a time of fellowship and joy that energizes, renews and strengthens you in your faith as we prepare for the Epiphany of Jesus Christ who came into the world in the form of a little babe humbling Himself so that we too could become children of God!




SHARE HIM WITH OTHERS

Compassionate Care Collection Carriage House

The CARRIAGE HOUSE, located on Lake Ave across from the Catholic cemetery, assists adults with serious mental illness to gain or rediscover per necessary to return to work or school, move into better places, stay out

skills and self-esteem necessary to return to work or school, move into better places, stay out of the hospital and re-claim their lives. The CARRIAGE HOUSE has 2,000 Club Members, most of whom live under the poverty level. As winter approaches they can use adult new or gently used clean jackets and new warm hats and gloves. Collection baskets are in the Ministry Center and North Corridor.
