The Intersection of Church & State examines the dynamic give-and-take relationship that has marked the crossroads of church and state in this country. Though roadblocks are frequent where the two meet, there is still tremendous potential for cooperative work to be done.

Using expert commentary from academics, church and civic leaders, agency professionals and others, this study underscores the healthy collaboration between church and state in caring for the needy, settling refugees, child adoption, chaplain services and more. It will also consider how these historical church and state partnerships are jeopardized. In the end, it will suggest a far superior metaphor in describing the churchstate relationship is not one using a wall or barrier but, instead, an intersection, which benefits us all.

Drums Alive is a program that utilizes "whole brain – whole body" thinking by developing sensory motor reflexes and kinesthetic awareness. The physiological and psychological benefits are numerous including those found in traditional forms of aerobic fitness. Drumming has also been found to improve and increase the neurological connection between the 2 brain hemispheres, stimulating Alpha brain wave activity which can lead to higher levels of concentration, sensory/motor improvement, and an overall sense of well-being.

In Drums of Praise, Certified Drums Alive Coach, Alicia Rodenbeck, will lead participants through a short meditation on a verse highlighting God's Masterwork in the human body before leading a fun and uplifting drumming workout suitable for all ages and abilities. Come to drum away some stress or to dance and find some joy!




From Mourning to Joy with Michelle Leahy

Not sure what a churro is? You'll be delighted to try this popular dessert or breakfast food found throughout Uruguay. These long thin-shaped fried pastries are not too complicated to make. The main ingredients are flour, baking powder, oil and boiling water. The churro recipe often



varies according to the different traditions and flavors you might find in Latin American and European countries. In Uruguay, the yerba mate tea is a perfect match for any churro. Other countries traditionally serve them with melted chocolate or caramel sauce, might be coated in cinnamon sugar, or filled with chocolate, cream, or dulce de leche. In any case, the secret to a good churro is for it to be crispy on the outside and fluffy on the inside.
