

Happy New Year,

It's often a habit, at the start of the new year, to pull out a fresh calendar and input all of the upcoming events happening in your life: holidays, vacation, weddings, and tournaments. All of these things and more go on the calendar. You might look at them and think you have room to plan. Or maybe you'll think, "Oh dear, how will I get this all accomplished?" Either way, the year is planned.

In a similar way, God asked the Israelites to keep a calendar and told them what days of each month would be holy days. He planned specific days and events like Passover, Feast of Weeks, and the Day of Atonement. There are others as well and through these holy days, God marked out for His people how and when He would be with them as they worshiped.

In your lives, God is with you each and every day, and always has been. Even though you might not write, "This is the day that God has made," on each calendar day, they are still the days that God has given to you. These are days God has provided for you. Each day God has been close to you and has heard your prayers and given you forgiveness.

Your 2023 calendar may not show yet how God will be with you, but if you took a look at last year's calendar you might remember how God's planning overlapped with yours. Before you even knew it, God had already marked on the calendar of your life how He would be with you. The same is true this new year; before you even write the first event down, God promised to be, "with you always, to the end of the age." Matt. 28:20
