All thanks, praise, and glory be to God for allowing us to join Him on His mission of saving souls though the faithful proclamation of the life, death, and resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ to all people! You know, that mission has been carried out by the faithful people of St. Peter's for the past 168 years and it's our earnest prayer and intention for it to continue to be carried out until the Day of our Lord's return. Case Statement for a 2023-26 Capital Campaign

Since 1855 the people of St. Peter's Lutheran Church have been a steady presence in offering salvation through Christ Jesus to the community around us. Our use and care of the 40 acres of our property give testimony to the faith we profess as God's people. Our sanctuary serves as the hub from which flows a variety of ministry activities. In the sanctuary baptisms are administered, Holy Communion is celebrated, and God's Word of forgiveness and salvation is proclaimed to us. In the sanctuary we sing hymns of praise to our gracious and loving Lord, offer up our prayers to Him, and boldly confess Him as the one, true and living God. Yes, from cradle to grave, our sanctuary is the central place where God's people are served with the saving gospel of Jesus Christ and where His holy name is acknowledged and praised.

The faith that is initiated and sustained through the Word and Sacrament ministry that takes place in our sanctuary continues to be nurtured through a variety of ministries that serve all ages. Our preschool, located in the lower level serves 82 children with a wide range of educational and faith enrichment programs. Our Day School, across the street from the sanctuary, serves 212 children from Kindergarten through 8 th grade with a quality Christ-centered education. Our Parish House located on the south portion of our property serves as gathering place for our Jr. and Sr. high youth groups, as well as a home for our Knotters group. Since the expansion and renovation project that was completed in 2014, we have used practically every square foot of available space to nurture the faith of our children, as well as the faith of our adults. Adult Bible studies, fellowship gatherings, and service groups have utilized all available spaces to carry out their various ministry tasks.

The 2014 facility expansion and renovation project has proven to be a tremendous blessing for St. Peter's in its mission to minister to people of all ages. By creating a "Community of Care" model for ministry, we are in the midst of forming an effective system that addresses the many needs and life circumstances that individuals and families encounter in those seasons of life that take place from the cradle to the grave. Preschool, Day School, and "Community of Care" have not only nurtured our St. Peter's members, but they have also proven to be an effective outreach to the surrounding area. In just a short time since the Community of Care was launched, we have already welcomed new individuals into our St. Peter's family who came to us with healing needs and stayed because of the love of Christ and His community they found here. Therefore, to keep our ministry going and growing, our Board of Directors (with input from Pastor Steve, Jenny Reith, and Principal Brune) have identified three critical issues that, if successfully addressed, will enable us as a congregation to continue to be that steady presence of offering the wonderful gift of salvation through Christ Jesus both now in the present as well as in the years to come. Those issues include:

• **Retire our loan balance.** The people of St. Peter's have done an outstanding job of moving Faithfully Forward to pay down our building debt. In fact, currently that debt, which began at \$6.6 million (plus interest), is now under the \$1 million mark. God be praised! It is, however, critically important that we have a plan to retire this debt completely so that the ministry work laid out in our annual operating budget can continue without the added stress of a mortgage payment. Retiring our debt not only allows us to continue with our budgeted ministry work uninterrupted, but it will also give us the freedom to explore what God might have in mind for us in the future in terms of ministry opportunities and facility improvements as laid out in our Master Plan.

- **Renovate our sanctuary.** As stated earlier, the sanctuary is the hub of all that we do in • the name of the Lord here at St. Peter's. In addition to over 300 worship services held in our sanctuary every year, it is also the place where funerals, weddings, baptisms, and a host of other special services and events are carried out. For those who are new to St. Peter's, this worship space offers the first impression to the overall ministry and tells a story of the care we show our church. Over the course of time, things wear out, repairs become necessary, and updates are needed in order to keep the sanctuary functional and inviting. Our pipe organ is a wonderful instrument that has faithfully led us through literally thousands of worship services over the past 63 years without any major malfunction. However, it is now clearly near the end of its life and is in dire need of a major overhaul and refurbishment. In addition, with the advancement of audio-visual technology to aid us in worship and to live stream it out to the community, now is the time to reconfigure our balcony space so that both music and A/V needs are adequately met. Also, the sanctuary flooring as well as the pew cushions are in need of replacement and repair. The replacement of the sanctuary flooring provides the perfect opportunity to consider the addition of new technology that would enable our hearing-impaired worshipers to connect to the A/V system to clearly hear all aspects of worship. Finally, due to the disruption that these various repairs and renovations would create, it would make the most sense to do all of these things in a coordinated way at the same time.
- **Repair our school.** Our day school ministry is critically important in carrying out our overall mission of making disciples. We have been blessed to operate a Lutheran day school, which keeps Christ at the center, since the conception of this congregation 168 year ago. Our day school is housed in a building that was built in 1948 and then added on to in 1957 and again in 1978. We have been good caretakers of a building that has seen a lot of wear and tear over the years. In 2014 some additional improvements and upgrades were made, but there are some things that still need to be addressed. For example, in the school gymnasium that is over 65 years old, the deteriorating ceiling needs to be replaced and painted. Furthermore, several windows have surpassed their useful operational life and are in need of replacement. Finally, we would like to finish providing A/C to the rest of building. During the renovations of 2014, A/C was added to the office and classrooms; however, other high use areas, such as the cafeteria and school gymnasium, remain without. These repairs and replacements will be prioritized and addressed as the funds become available while keeping debt reduction a top priority.
- Where do we go from here? We will be asking all our members of all generations to participate in a three-year campaign so that together we can accomplish these three goals to retire (our building loan), renovate (our sanctuary) and repair (our school). The total estimated cost to reach these three goals is \$1.6 million. Lord willing, a three-year campaign to raise that total amount would conclude right on the heels of the celebration of our 170 th anniversary as a congregation; what a wonderful way to cap off our 170 th year of existence as a congregation! By God's grace, we will have a renewed, inviting, and practical facility fully paid for, one that will serve both our present needs as well as the needs of the future so that St. Peter's can continue to be a solid and steady presence of faithfulness to Christ Jesus our Lord in this community and beyond.


